- The competition will be administered as per CONGU Rules
- A Junior must be eighteen years of age , or under, on 1 January 2017
- The Overall Winner must be sixteen years of age, or under, on 1 January 2017
- Entry limited to 90. **Official CONGU Handicap required.** All entrants may be subject to handicap ballot.
- 36 hole strokeplay competition - Round one - Struie Course; Round two - Championship Course.
- Boys from yellow tees, girls from red tees
- No caddies
- **Current handicap certificates must be produced at registration.** Entrants will play at current handicap
- Any Competitor who does not turn up for their appointed tee time without good reason and/or fails to inform the Club will not be eligible to compete in this event for three years.
- Results will be adjusted by the Committee in respect of girls' gross scores on the Championship Course by 5 strokes and by 3 strokes on the Struie to take account of the differences between SSS's of respective courses.
- Practice Rounds: Green fees on both courses will be discounted for competitors and a maximum of 2 accompanying players on Friday 6th October. Championship green fees are £50 adult and £25 junior and for Struie £15 adult and £7.50 junior.
- £10 entrance Fee to be paid at registration on first day of Competition
- Royal Dornoch Golf Club is fully committed to alleviating the problem of slow play. Our open competitions will have on course marshals and penalties applied to the culprits. As a condition of entry you are accepting the responsibility to keep a good pace of play as advertised at the time of the event and to complying with all the competition rules.
